## Inheritance Rule Mount Vema Royal Order

### **Rule 24102022-1**

Inheritance Rule is a Royal Mount Vema Order to regulate the transfer of private property, titles, debts, money, entitlements, privileges, rights, and obligations which passes on the death of a person.

*In exercise of the powers conferred upon The Sovereign of Vema Seamount under GOD, and of all other powers enabling Him, His Mount Vema Majesty King Peter Jon Goldishman, Ruler of the Kingdom of Mount Vema, and the territorial waters at 31 38' S 8° 20' E, under GOD hereby Grants His Royal Seal of Approval, for the following Rule:—*

### **1- Inheritance**

- a) This Rule 24102022-1 applies to all gratuitous acquisition of private property, titles, debts, money, entitlements, privileges, rights, and obligations which passes on the death of any person, by means of a transfer from one person (the predecessor) and to another person (the successor).
- b) This rule supersedes all statutory laws of the Kingdom of Mount Vema (The Vema Seamount Territory) in operation in connection with Inheritance.
- c) Bequeathing private property and/or debts within the jurisdiction of the Kingdom of Mount Vema, shall be performed by a testator via will, as attested by a notary or by other lawful means.

### **2- Registrar of Wills**

- d) A will shall be valid only when the appropriate form has been completed, sealed, and registered with three different agencies of the state to be determined by the secretary of state.
- e) The three agencies of state shall be (1) at district level, (2) at government, and at (3) royal Mount Vema establishment level. All to be appointed by the secretary of state as Registrar of Wills.

### **3- Absence of a Will**

- f) In the absence of a will, the firstborn or whoever is next in line shall be the one who shall be entitled to the inheritance. And in the absence of a firstborn (heirs apparent), the presumptive heirs shall be entitled to the inheritance.

### **4- Levy**

- g) From time to time the secretary of state may introduce a levy on transfer of inheritance of any kind within the jurisdiction of the Kingdom of Mount Vema and the amount shall be determined by statutory instruments only to be introduced by an act of Mount Vema Congress or by Mount Vema Royal Order.

### **5- Citation**

This Rule may be cited as Royal Mount Vema Order - **Rule 24102022-1.**
